Occupational Therapists	OTs help people to gain or regain the ability to do everyday activities that they need or want to do. OTs evaluate barriers to successful performance of tasks, and then intervene to help people develop skills, modify the environment and/or alter how the task is done. Pharmacists	Fill prescriptions, verifying instructions from physicians on the proper usage of medication. Check whether the prescription will interact negatively with other drugs that a patient is taking. Counsel patients on how to take a prescribed medicine and potential side effects. Physician Assistant	Practice medicine in a variety of health care settings as a member of a healthcare team with physicians and other providers. In outpatient or inpatient settings, PAs complete medical history and exams, order and interpret tests, diagnose and treat illnesses, counsel patients, assist in surgery, and prescribe medications. Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) Techs	Operate Magnetic Resonance Imaging (MRI) scanners. Nuclear Medicine Techs	Use a scanner to create images of various areas of a patient's body. They prepare radioactive drugs and administer them to patients undergoing the scans.
