

Intermediate Algebra Registration

At UNM, *MATH 1215 – Intermediate Algebra* requires a co-requisite of *UNIV 102 – Intermediate Algebra Learning Strategies*, which provides preparation for upcoming concepts and additional support to help you successfully master the course content.

These courses are paired section-by-section, which means you need to register for UNIV 102 with the same section number as your MATH 1215 course. For example, MATH 1215 section 001 is paired with UNIV 102 section 001. You can view section numbers in the registration portal:

When you “Enter Your Search Criteria” in the registration portal, you can search for both courses at the same time:

Subject

Keyword

Subject and Course Number

and if you sort by ‘Section’ number

the registration portal will group pairs together for you.

Because these two courses are co-requisites, you must register for them at the exact same time. Add both MATH 1215 and UNIV 102 to your summary in the registration portal *before* you click ‘Submit’ to register.
